To ensure our students' safety, here are a few reminders for drivers navigating school zones.

- Follow school zone speed limits whenever children are present. This always applies, not just during school hours.
- Be prepared to stop for a school bus at any time.
- Remember to stop whenever you approach a stopped school bus with its red lights flashing, regardless of the direction of travel or which lane the bus is in. Give yourself extra time during your morning commute
- Always watch for pedestrians. There are more kids walking, riding, and getting dropped off in school zones.
- Always obey crossing guards and no parking zones.
- We ask that parents/guardians never drive on school property

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## FEBRUARY IS REGISTRATION MONTH

Effective February 1, 2023, we will be accepting registrations for the 2023-2024 school year through our new online portal, PowerSchool Enrollment.! **Tip:** Before you begin, make sure you have the following documents in electronic form (image, PDF or Word document):

- Proof of identity/age with one of the following: birth certificate, passport, immigration papers, or legal adoption papers) if you are new to the HRCE;
- Proof of home address (a recently dated official government or utility document with your current address that includes your name and date, such as water bill, power bill, internet bill, home fuel bill, a tax receipt, property assessment or a mortgage contract); and
- Nova Scotia Health Card or Canadian Province Health Card or, for non-citizens while in Canada, proof of Medical Insurance Information.

#### LATE FRENCH IMMERSION PROGRAM

Late French Immersion Programs are offered in designated areas of eligibility of the Halifax Regional Centre for Education and take place at specific French Immersion school sites. The entry point to the Late French Immersion program is at Grade 7. #### LOCKDOWN DRILLS

The safety and security of our students and staff are a top priority at our school and the Halifax Regional Centre for Education. We have been implementing a number of measures as part of a comprehensive plan aimed at ensuring our school remains a safe place for our students to learn. All classrooms will participate in our a lockdown drill in the coming weeks. During a lockdown drill, classroom doors are secured and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building. Students are isolated within the school whenever circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown drill. Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to running a drill. We will also take time to debrief after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger.

## **SEVERE WEATHER CLOSURES**

The Halifax Regional Centre for Education takes great care when making the decision to alter the normal operations of schools in the event of severe or inclement weather. Any decisions on



school closures, delayed openings or bus cancellations are posted on HRCE's website at www.hrce.ca, on twitter @HRCE\_NS recorded on 464-4636 and communicated to all local radio stations. You can also receive notice of school and bus cancellations by e-mail or text message by following the link on the front page (left side) of the HRCE website.

#### **DELAYED OPENING**



If weather conditions warrant, the Halifax Regional Centre for Education could implement a delayed opening. Delaved openings would be considered when a severe weather event has concluded but snow clearing or other operations require additional time. Delayed opening may also be considered when the school is experiencing an issue such as a power outage or loss of water and additional time is required to prepare the school to open. If this was to occur, school would be delayed by two hours. For Mount Edward Elementary, school would start at 10:50 a.m. with outdoor supervision starting 10 minutes prior to that time (10:40 a.m.). Classes would resume at 11:00 a.m. after our regular routine of morning announcements and O'Canada. With a delayed opening, the Excel program would be cancelled for the morning only. Our lunch, afternoon schedule and dismissal times would remain at their regularly scheduled times. Excel would be open for their regularly scheduled afternoon hours.
