HOW TO ENCOURAGE INDEPENCENCE IN CHILDREN

It may seem counterintuitive at first, but letting kids make mistakes will teach them how to succeed in life. When they make a mistake, let them know it's OK and help them brainstorm how they might do better next time.

This mindset shift can guide anything from small mistakes, like choosing not to wear a coat to school when the forecast calls for rain, to larger ones, like failing a test because they decided to wait until the night before to study.

It's hard to see your child struggle. But if you focus on teaching them that failure is just feedback, it helps develop a growth mindset, and with that mindset, they will be able to overcome any struggle confidently.

SchoolMessenger SafeArrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for families to inform their child's school if they will be away – powers all three of these options.

OUT OF **A**REA **R**EQUESTS

Parents/guardians may seek placement for their child in a school outside of the neighbourhood in which they reside under the guidelines of the <u>Student Registration Policy</u>. Out-of-area requests can be made for students in Grades Primary to 12. **The out-of-area transfer is permanent**.

By accepting an out-of-area transfer, families are responsible for transporting their child to and from school. Please contact the <u>Student Transportation Team</u> if you have questions about bus eligibility.
