LIFE SKILLS FOR FAMILIES

Teaching children how to solve their own problems is a skill that begins in early childhood. When they are little, the problems might be over who gets the blue truck or who has more playdough, but those problems grow into bigger issues as the children get bigger. Teaching them steps to solve problems is a critical lifelong skill.

Teach your child basic problem solving steps such as learning to identify exactly what the problem is, thinking of solutions to the problem, analyzing those solutions for fairness and then trying it out to see if it worked. Help your children work through the steps, but resist the urge to give them the answer. As they get older, encourage them to talk directly with their teacher about forgotten homework or the dentist about the broken retainer. The ability to confront problems head on and deal with the consequences truly is a life skill!

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

April brings the prospects of warmer weather, the beginning of Term 3 and a continued focus by staff to meet the learning needs of all students. Every effort is made to respond to concerns within 48 hours after you make the first call. How long it will take to resolve the problem will vary depending on the nature of the concern.

OUT OF **A**REA **R**EQUESTS

Out-of-area requests for the 2023-24 school year will open on April 3, 2023 at 8 a.m.

Parents/guardians may seek placement for their child in a school outside of the neighbourhood in which they reside under the guidelines of the <u>Student Registration Policy</u>. Out-of-area requests can be made for students in Grades Pre-Primary to 12. **The out-of-area transfer is permanent**.

By accepting an out-of-area transfer, families are responsible for transporting their child to and from school.
