

#### LIFE SKILLS FOR FAMILIES

As adults, we know a lot about consequences. But for children, it is more complicated. If they don't want to wear their coat, their parents or teachers might make them, and the child doesn't' learn that it's cold out, which is why they needed the coat! Or, if an older child forgets their lunch, homework or gym shoes, and Mom or Dad runs them up to school every time, they aren't learning the lesson that bringing their belongings to school is their responsibility.

Children learn best through natural consequences. Whenever possible, allow your child to experience the natural, or logical if natural is not safe or appropriate, consequences of their actions. If they leave the cap off of their markers, they are dried up for next time. Don't replace the toy that is left out in the rain and ruined. Help children learn about what happens when they do not follow rules or aren't responsible for their belongings.

One of your most important tasks as a parent is to raise independent, resilient children who can venture into the world and solve their own problems. With some forethought and planning, you can help nurture your child's growing independence!

# SAFEARRIVAL BY SCHOOLMESSENGER FOR FAMILIES TO REPORT STUDENT ABSENCES

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive to school safely each day. Parents/guardians of students who attend our school are asked to report their child's absence in advance using a toll-free number, the PowerSchool Parent Portal or the SchoolMessenger app!

SchoolMessenger SafeArrival – an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for families to inform their child's school if they will be away – powers all three of these options.

If your child will be absent, please let us know by using one of the following methods:

- **Toll-Free Number**—Call 1-833-582-6940 to report an absence using an automated system.
- **PowerSchool Parent Portal**—Log into https://sishrsb.ednet.ns.ca/public/ and access the SchoolMessenger website to report an absence.
- SchoolMessenger App—Download the SchoolMessenger app for Android and iOS devices and sign up using your PowerSchool username (full email address).
